### **Classroom Management Plan/Project**

*Assignment:* Each student will reflect on classroom lectures and discussions, course readings and his or her own experiences to design a classroom management plan for his or her own classroom (approximately 5 pages). I am also open to ideas for presenting your management plan in a format other than a paper (PPT presentation, video clip, etc.). Creativity is encouraged. Just let me know your idea. The plan must address each area described below.

Due Date -At the end of the semester, in lieu of a final. Date to be determined in class.

*Grading* - This assignment is worth 20% of your grade and will be graded on a 100-point scale according to the rubric on page two.

*Note*: This paper can be done using the headings listed below.

### Section One: Context

Describe the ideal teaching context for your first year of teaching. Include information such as the grade, subject(s), type of community and student population in which you would ideally like to land your first job.

# Section Two: Physical Design

Based on your ideal context, create a visual representation of the physical layout of your classroom. Your visual representation must be accompanied by a brief written explanation of why you organized your classroom in this way. This explanation must discuss the two functions from Steele's framework that you choose to emphasize and why you feel these two are most important for you. Note: Your visual representation can be created with one of the suggested websites, a self-made drawing, other computer programs or tools or another idea that you may have.

# Section Three: Rules

• Explain your plan for developing the classroom rules. Will they be student- or teacher generated or a combination of the two? Why? What process will you use to develop and teach the rules to your students?

### **Section Four: Routines**

 Select 8 tasks/areas from the three areas of classroom routines (class running, lesson running and interaction) that you believe are the most important in helping your classroom run smoothly. Then, briefly explain your routine for each of those tasks/areas.

### Section Five: Relationships

- Describe 3 specific strategies that you plan to incorporate into your practice that will allow your students to know that you care about them.
- Describe 3 specific strategies you plan to incorporate into your practice that will help foster a sense of community among your students.

### Section Six: Discipline

• Explain your plan for responding to misbehavior in the classroom. Your plan must address the different types of misbehavior that will occur in the classroom (minor, more serious and chronic).

<ul> <li>Section 6 Discipline</li> <li>Discusses a logical plan for responding to the three different types of misbehavior (minor, more serious, chronic) in the classroom</li> </ul>	/20 points
